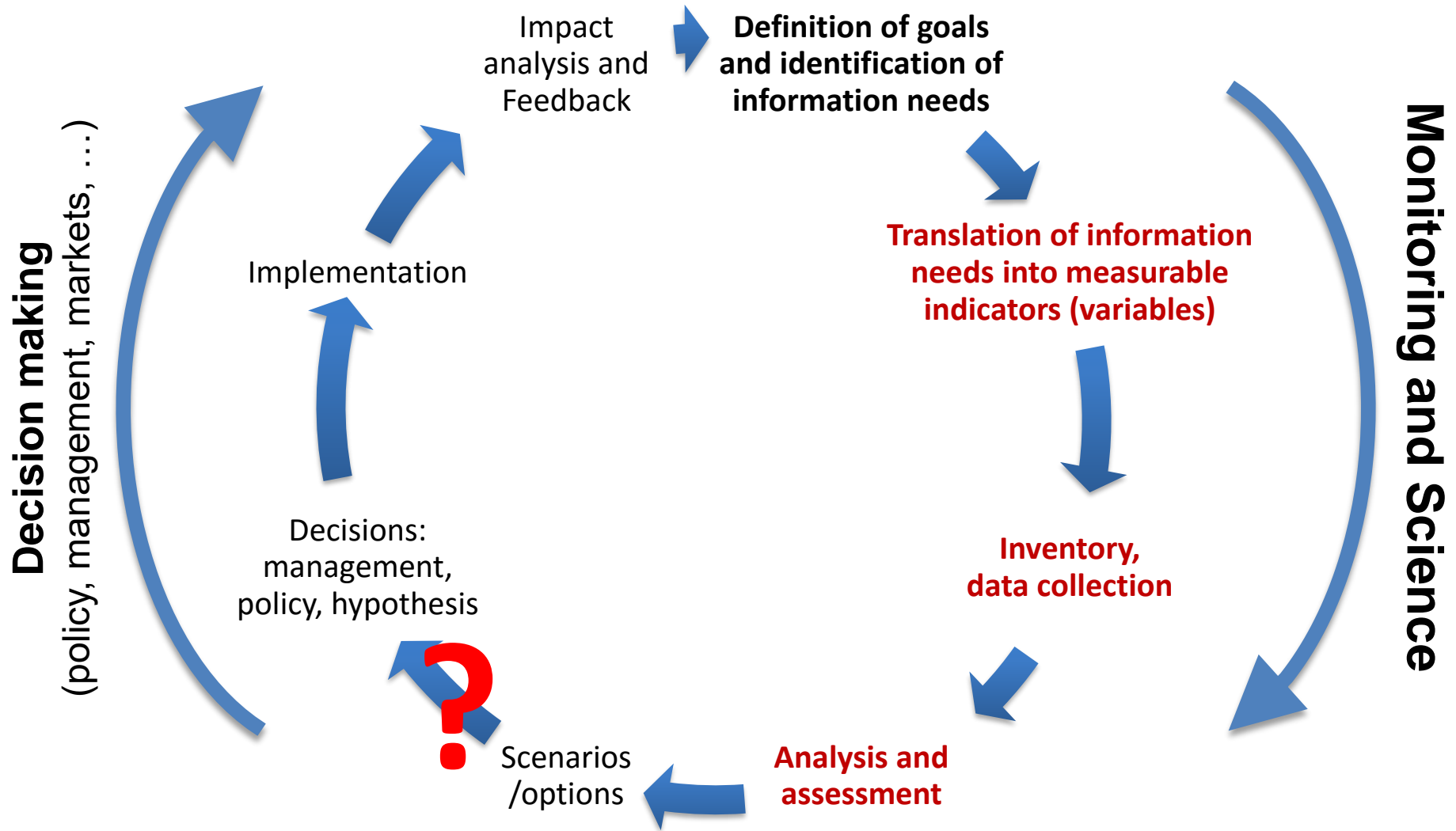
Increasing complexity in decision making

- **Complexity of management decisions**
 - Multiple and diverse management goals and purposes
 - Various constraints and restrictions (cross sectoral)
 - Increasing information need (typical for complex systems)
- **Complexity of required target information**
 - The translation of general information need (e.g. „biodiversity“ or „degradation“) into measurable indicators needs clear definitions
- **Complexity of technologies for information provision**
 - Transforming data into information requires a lot of expertise
 - Integration of multiple data sources is a methodological challenge

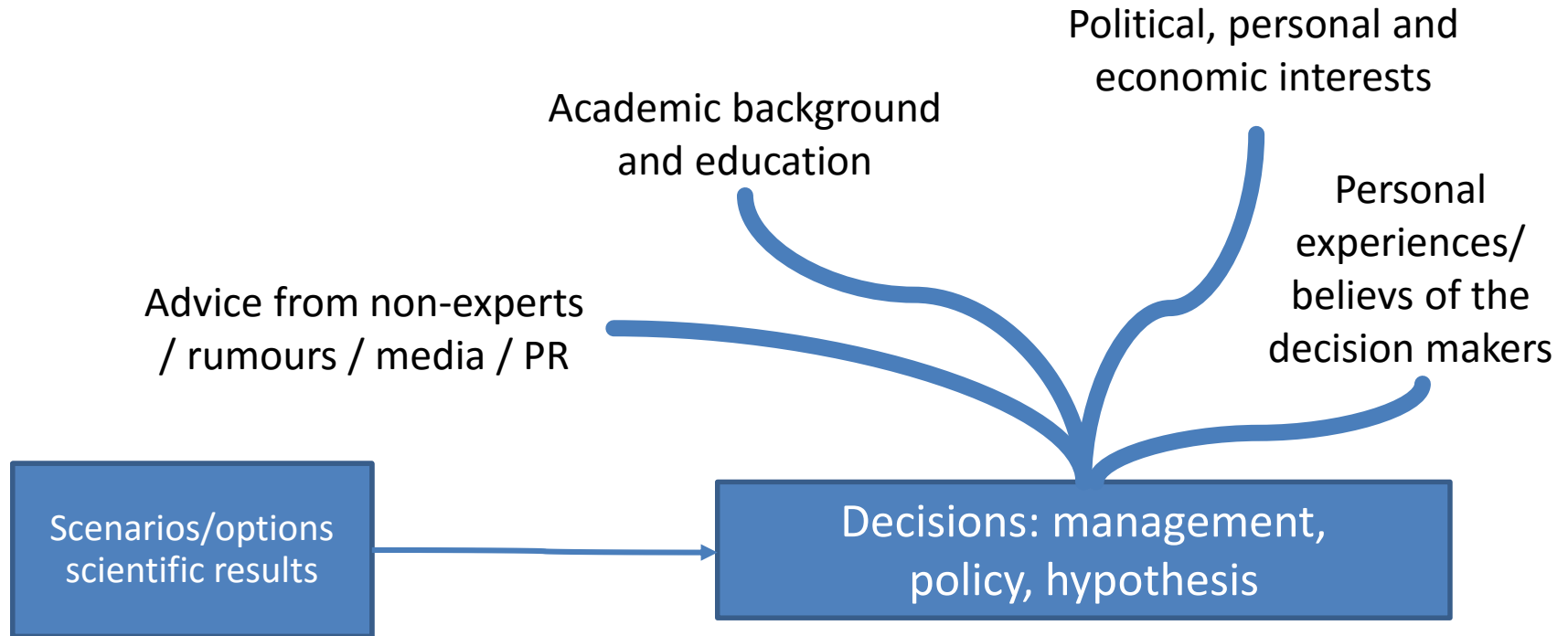

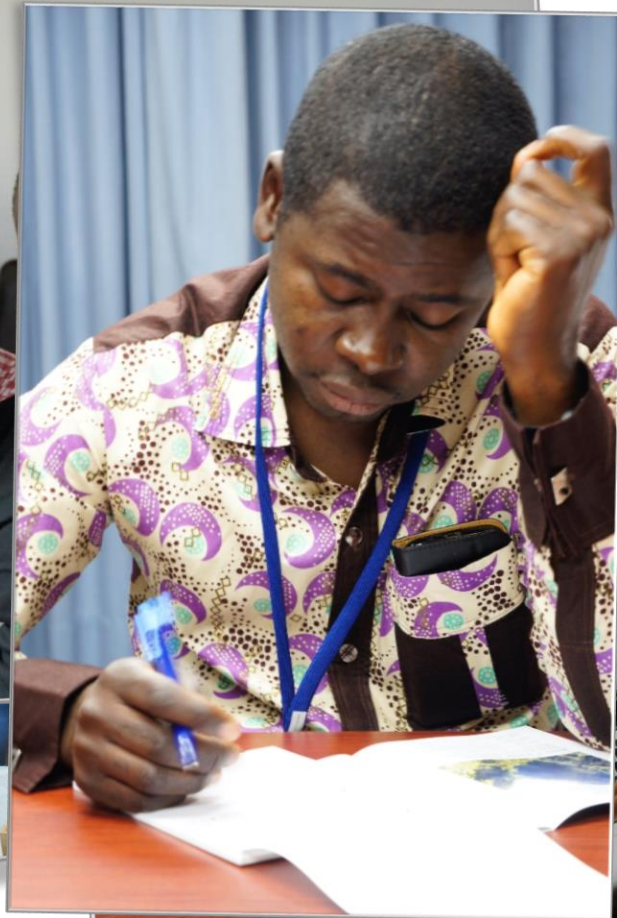

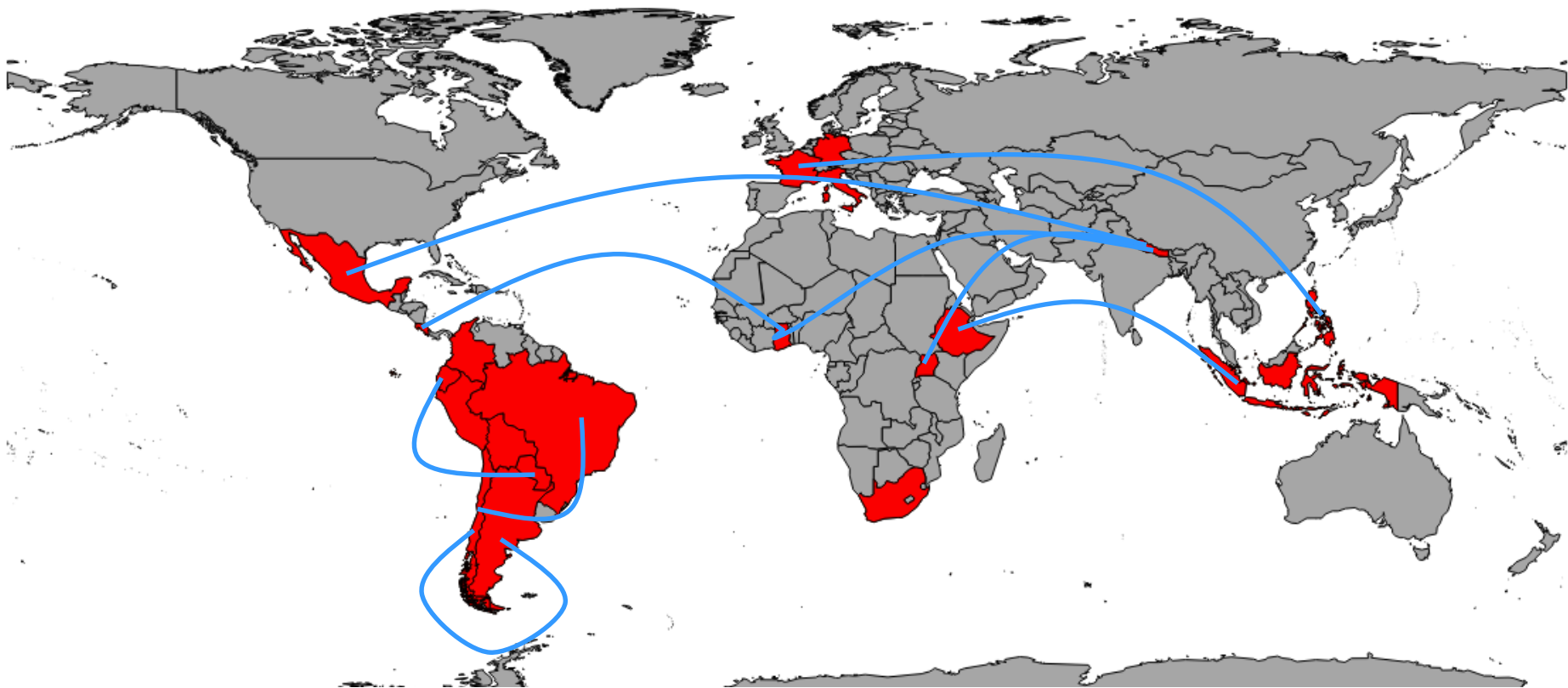
